The Career and Technical Studies major offers training in Vocational Program Development and Vocational Teacher Education. The Program Development Specialization is designed to prepare students to plan, supervise, conduct, and evaluate training programs in business, industry, and government. The B.S. degree program in Career and Technical Studies/Vocational Teacher Education offers training in vocational program development and vocational teacher education. The program development sequence is designed to prepare students to plan, supervise, conduct, and evaluate training programs in business, industry, and government. The teacher education sequence prepares students to work in vocational high schools. Completion of this program will result in a degree in vocational teacher education. However, certification in vocational education in Florida is granted by local school districts. Documented minimum of 2 years of full time work experience is required.

PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

In addition to general University requirements, students must meet the requirements listed below.

Consult with your academic advisor for courses which may satisfy both the General Studies requirements and common prerequisites. A minimum grade of "C" must be earned in courses required by the department.

Candidates for admission to UWF's NCATE/DOE approved teacher education programs must meet admission requirements detailed under Admission to Teacher Education. In addition to the program requirements noted below, teacher education students must also complete requirements specified under Teacher Education.

Vocational Teacher Education majors must include in the lower division requirements at least 9 sh of course work with international or diversity focus. Consult with your academic advisor for appropriate courses.

Common Prerequisites (24 sh)

The State of Florida mandates specified courses for the Educational Studies in Teacher Education program. These courses, when combined with the University's general studies program requirements, comprise 60 hours of lower division courses. In addition to three specified education courses (EDF1005, EDG2701, and EME2040), 45 hours must be chosen from the following liberal arts and sciences areas: (a) communications; (b) mathematics; (c) natural and/or physical sciences; (d) fine arts and/or humanities; and (e) social sciences. The hours must include as a minimum:

- Nine hours in English to include writing, literature, and speech.
- Nine hours in science to include earth science, life science, and physical science with a minimum of one associated lab.
- Nine hours in mathematics to include college algebra or above and geometry.
- Twelve hours in social sciences to include American history and general psychology.
- Six hours in humanities to include philosophy and fine arts.

In addition to EDG2701, a minimum of 6 hours with an international or diversity focus is required.
