The M.A. program is designed for students interested in international relations, comparative politics, American government, and public policy. Additionally, the program is affiliated with a consortium formed by the U.S. Navy and several civilian graduate schools. Students may be allowed to transfer a maximum of 15 semester hours from one member of the consortium to another.

The program consists of 33 semester hours plus successful completion of a comprehensive examination.

All new students should be advised initially by the department chairperson. After their first semester, students should select their advisor from the program faculty.

In addition to general University requirements, students seeking the M.A. in Political Science must meet the requirements listed below.

Electives (6-12 sh)

Thesis students take 6 sh of electives while non-thesis students take 12 sh of electives. With the approval of their advisors, students may take 6 semester hours in disciplines outside Political Science. They may enroll in an undergraduate course for graduate credit to learn the fundamentals of a discipline, or in a directed readings course to explore in greater depth an area of interest in political science.

Thesis Option (0-6 sh)

Students may choose to complete a Thesis (POS 6971 - 6 sh) in lieu of completing 6 sh of electives.
