The B.A. is awarded to students in two specializations: studio art and art history. Within the Studio Art Specialization students can elect concentrations in drawing, electronic art and design, painting, sculpture, ceramics, and photography. Art History students can elect a traditional course of study or one tailored to museum work.

The Art Education Minor, combined with the Studio Art Specialization, provides the necessary background to participate in the alternative certification process offered by Florida school districts. Students who enroll in this minor must complete specific courses in the Studio Art Specialization to ensure the breadth of knowledge necessary for teaching art in public and private schools. These courses are listed in the Art Education Minor.

## PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

In addition to general University requirements, students seeking the B.A. in Art must meet the requirements listed below.

A grade of "C" or better must be earned in all courses that are identified as common prerequisites, major, or major-related. The art faculty advisor must approve all course choices.

## MINORS

### Art (18 sh)

Students may earn a Minor in Art by completing 18 sh in art and/or art history courses with permission of an assigned art advisor (see chairperson for details). Of the 18 sh, at least 12 sh of credit toward the minor must be taken at UWF. No fewer than 12 sh must be at the 3/4000 level. Art majors may not earn this minor.

### Art Teaching (28-30 sh)

The Art Education Minor is available only to students enrolled in the Studio Art Specialization. It is designed to prepare students to teach art in the public schools. In addition to education and art education courses, students pursuing the Art Education Minor are required to take specific studio art electives to ensure the breadth of competencies necessary to teach art in the public schools. This Art Education Minor may lead to State of Florida K-12 Art Teacher certification via Florida's school district alternative certification program.

Students interested in obtaining art certification to teach this subject area need to meet all the B.A. Studio Art degree requirements, all of the Art Education Minor requirements, and participate in the State of Florida school district alternative certification program.

A grade of "C" or higher is required in all courses required by the minor.
