The Interdisciplinary Humanities program is designed for those who wish a broad preparation in the humanities rather than a specialization in one discipline. It is appropriate for those students who are not certain which single humanities discipline they wish to elect as a major. While flexible, this program requires concentration in at least three humanities disciplines.

## PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

In addition to general University requirements, students seeking the B.A. in Interdisciplinary Humanities must meet the requirements listed below. Course descriptions are listed alphabetically by prefix in the back of this *Catalog*.

A grade of "C" or higher must be earned in all courses used to fulfill major requirements. Additionally, Students must earn a 2.50 cumulative GPA in the major.

### Lower Division Electives (24 sh)
