The Interdisciplinary Humanities program is designed for those who wish a broad preparation in the humanities rather than a specialization in one discipline. It is appropriate for those students who are not certain which single humanities discipline they wish to elect as a major. While flexible, this program requires concentration in at least three humanities disciplines.

## PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

In addition to general University requirements, students seeking the B.A. in Interdisciplinary Humanities must meet the requirements listed below.

A grade of "C" or higher must be earned in all courses used to fulfill major requirements. Additionally, Students must earn a 2.50 cumulative GPA in the major.
